## The NFA Today

The *One Big Beautiful Bill* passed both the Senate and the House and was signed into law on July 4th, 2025. Whatever you, dear reader, may think of that bill, there is one aspect of it that is worth examining here in the context of the Second Amendment.

The unconstitutional breach of liberty titled the *National Firearms Act (NFA)* has ever loomed over the heads of American citizens.

Enforced by the trigger-happy murder squad called the ATF, it remains a blemish on the generation who passed it, condemning those voting in favor of it to history's ledger of willful tyrants. It not only adds a significant chilling effect to the purchase of listed items but also provides the ATF with free access to millions and millions of Americans' data. Of course, they



abuse this data in any way open to them, making life as difficult as they can for anyone they deem a ripe target. It has been a mechanism for control, echoing back to an era when tyranny

Congress has rightly decided that the NFA has gone too far. While they did not vote to abolish it, they did strike a blow to many aspects of it, possibly a fatal one—though only time will.

When the NFA was shamefully passed into “law,” a tax stamp was placed upon the items listed within the bill. While they could not reasonably outright ban the items, they opted to place an intentional, financial

infringement upon them. The tax stamp was set to \$200, a value at the time that made the items in the list cost-prohibitive to everyday Americans. The blatant constitutional infringement was calculated and deliberate, designed to prevent people from being able to afford the listed items.

this? You’re slapped with pejoratives like “paranoid” or “extremist”.

Meanwhile, the runaway agencies who don’t answer to you write restrictions on liberty, bypassing the legislature. What’s worse than a king? A thousand kings disguised as bureaucrats. You didn’t vote for the ATF. You didn’t elect the alphabet soup of bureaucracies choking your rights in the name of “safety.” You just live under them—quietly. Obediently.

While there are some shock-and-awe from the house of tyranny, mostly the erosion hasn’t been sudden. It’s been slow, almost polite. But make no mistake—

# Memorial

The U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum seeks to honor the memory of all the precious lives taken during the Holocaust and remind visitors of what's at stake when we comply with evil. While we can all certainly appreciate what the museum does and stands for, the bitter irony of the museum's policies does not escape our very keen constitutional senses.

A museum which honors the victims of that most abhorrent assault on freedom and life begins its introduction to its guests by ensuring they are all disarmed before entering the building. There is a very valuable lesson to be gleaned from this contradictory objective, and that is that even those with the best of intentions can unwittingly add to the conditions that permit those with evil intent to make victims of people. 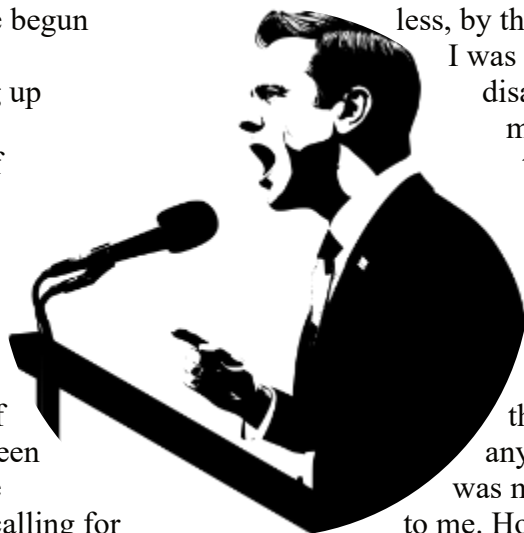

Arguably, if there is no tax, there is no need for a registry on those specific items. Many pro-2A groups are already taking aim at the NFA’s now-unreasonable registry of these items, which can no longer be taxed at any real value. The *de facto* effect of eliminating the monetary tax stamp on the items listed above may very well be to make them as they should have always been: unregulated under the NFA. Again, only time will tell.

The war on the NFA and its fan-boy (ATF) continues. We sincerely hope to see the presumed need for the ATF eliminated soon, along with the ATF itself. While we at JPFO won’t hold our breath, we’ll sit not-so-quietly by, cheering on the demise of them both.

it’s disarmament. And it’s wrapped in the language of concern, of compromise of peace, of safety. The very same lies and gambits tyrants have used for millennia.

Liberty wasn’t safe in 1776, and it isn’t safe now. It isn’t tame, and it isn’t easy. It’s dangerous by design. That’s why it must be defended by people who understand the stakes—and who refuse to forget what it took to win it in the first place.

And more importantly—recognize what has been, and is being, taken. True liberty requires will and purpose. It requires us to notice our stolen rights and fight the government tendrils that have extended too far.

# The Great Misdirection

Brady, the notorious anti-liberty group that promotes a government monopoly on violence and openly attacks the Second Amendment & the right to keep and bear arms it protects, claims to be “united against gun violence.” What a strange thing to unite against since “gun violence” is a completely imaginary phenomenon. So far, scientists have yet to show a single incident of a gun randomly committing violence on its own without human intervention. Perhaps they got their mission statement from their fairy godmother.

To further demonstrate their complete disconnect from reality, they claim that “the ATF is the only governmental agency enforcing crucial gun-industry regulations and the legislation responsible for historic declines in gun crimes. Targeted cuts will make it nearly impossible for the ATF to do its life-saving work. With no controls, anyone will be able to get

their hands on guns, and none of us will be safe.”

In a mass email begging would-be subjects to donate to a global civilian disarmament agenda, they demonstratively showcase their ignorance of guns, freedom and law enforcement in general.

Ironically, they are proposing policies that have historically led directly to civil unrest, tyrannical governments, surveillance states, mass murder and genocide. Advocating the shift of power toward a small group of pampered, bloated, elitist, career politicians—commanding overwhelming military and police force—belies their true (albeit, perhaps unwitting) agenda: subversion of the civilian population. Using fear padded by subtle, alluring half-truths, they support a government agency that has a record of murdering civilians with firearms that civilians may obtain only

through insider trading while in Congress in order to better fund and train police. This paradigm shift in policy for one man has crept its way into the halls of Congress, inspiring more and more politicians to do the same noble thing, disarm themselves, refuse security and join the rest of Americans on American streets, giving up the safety of extravagant gated and guarded communities.

“I don’t know how I didn’t notice this error in my thinking before,” said another reformed politician, “I just can’t imagine what people must have thought of me, asking them to give up a fundamental right to protect themselves and their families when I was not willing to do the same. It was

the right decision. Now, I know people are making a big a deal about me being robbed since I moved downtown but no one was hurt. They’re all just overreacting. It’s just a couple of bruises and a missing TV. Perspective, people.”

The move for politicians to join everyday Americans under the same rules they insist on imposing on us has sparked an uprising in the Congress, as the voters are flocking to these politicians. jumping through legal hoops and paying “tax stamps,” and others we are forbidden from owning at all. Not only does Brady have their facts wrong, but they seem to expect everyone to ignore the atrocities of the very agency they seek to defend.

It’s hard to imagine a group so utterly blind to the obvious truth—borne out by public, historic records—that they could, whether intentionally or not, openly advocate for the brutal enslavement and murder of millions through their proposed policies. There is ignorance, and then there is willful

ignorance. It’s difficult not to suspect that Brady suffers from the latter.

There are only a handful of NGOs that can boast such a strange but strong alliance with the unholy ATF. Brady is among the few organizations that seem bound and determined to ignore the ATF’s overbearing tactics, no-knock warrants that lead to suspects killed in their homes, overreach of executive powers in the legislative realm, and outright murder of civilians all while using firearms—ones Brady calls “assault weapons.” Again, we are left viewing this bizarre relationship

askance, wondering how Brady could call for the ban of “assault weapons” yet support an agency that uses such weapons to murder people. One possible answer is that those who support such policies may be more comfortable with authoritarian control than personal liberty.

We at JPFO may never fully understand people who work for groups like Brady, but—us working in good conscience and good faith—at least history won’t have to make excuses for our actions the way it may one day have to for theirs.

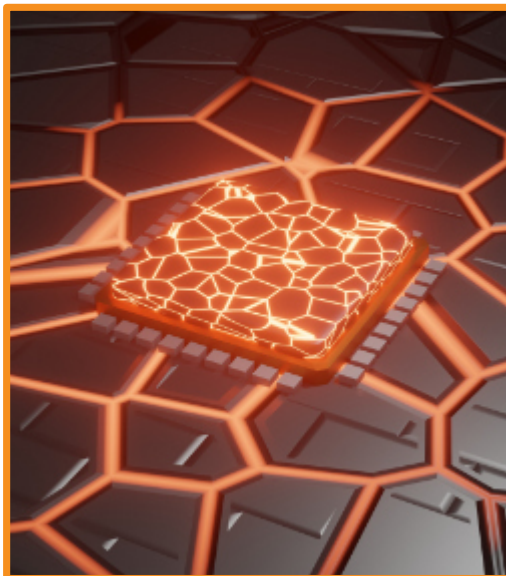

## Silicon Enforcement

Law enforcement discretion in granting concealed carry permits was rejected by the United States Supreme Court (SCOTUS) in *NYSRPA v. Bruen*. All licensing schemes must now be categorically unbiased and objective. However, in matters not only of licensing but also sales, restrictions, and more, many lower courts have effectively thumbed their noses at SCOTUS—ignoring its ruling and affirming unconstitutional legal frameworks that target law-abiding gun owners and firearms or accessories plainly protected by the Second Amendment. Seeking



disarmament and total control, those pressing against the Constitution are likely already looking ahead to how they might implement even more oppressive schemes using emerging technologies. Moving beyond spying on citizens’ social media accounts as grounds for denials, those in power are now looking to computer technology as the *coup de grâce* of tyrannical “gun control.”

With the advent of machine learning, large language models (LLM), and other AI-related technologies such as natural language processing

and reinforcement learning, more and more systems are being augmented—or outright controlled—by what is now colloquially (and in this article) referred to as AI. While AI development hasn't quite commercially reached full human-level intelligence, it tends to mimic it rather well. Among other things, it has language comprehension, pattern recognition, problem-solving skills, and can reason to some degree. It can learn from data, remember conversations, crunch data at an alarming rate, and run

massive datasets for law enforcement and intelligence agencies. BriefCam processes surveillance footage to identify patterns and individuals. Jasper writes marketing copy and ad content. Babylon Health offers AI-driven medical triage. And DoNotPay bills itself as a “robot lawyer” for handling legal paperwork and disputes. Even Wolfram Alpha—a powerful math and computational engine—now integrates with AI, making it even more powerful and versatile than before. These are just a few of the AI systems



billions of calculations per second. But, so far, it lacks things like intuition, emotion, and world experience—with these little add-ons coming soon enough no doubt.

While there are generalized AI bots, there are specialized AI bots as well, being programmed and taught to do specific tasks very well. ChatGPT handles natural language processing and conversation. DALL·E generates images from text prompts. ShotSpotter detects gunfire using acoustic sensors. Clearview AI performs facial recognition by scraping billions of online images. Palantir analyzes

available. And, while AI may be a great boon for humanity in many ways, like any new tech, it's just as easily forged into shackles—and there are those who will try.

As this field of science continues to progress at a very rapid rate, new fields have been emerging as well. Quantum computing, for example, threatens to undermine the very substance of our current encryption systems. That little lock in your web browser's URL field, which indicates your connection is secure, also validates that your connection is using the latest web encryption protocol. The most up-to-date encryption

technology that prevents others from spying on your online activity (such as usernames, passwords, banking, etc.) is called RSA. Named after the group of men who created it, RSA is a method using keys built essentially from very large prime numbers (a number divisible only by itself and 1). Without going into all the nuts and bolts of how RSA works, suffice it to say that the method is predicated on the idea that very large primes are extremely easy to multiply together but the factors of such a multiplication process are practically impossible to determine. It's much like baking a cake and then trying to extract the eggs out of

the final product. While a theoretical possibility, there are no known practical ways to do that. In the same light, there are no known ways to quickly (in anything less than several million years) find the factors of the multiplication of two very large prime numbers...until now.

While computers can make billions of calculations per second, they must do these in sequence. Each process must wait its turn in line. In quantum computing however, billions of calculations or comparisons can be made simultaneously. Instead of taking several million years to try every possible factor of a large number, it could find them in hours or minutes. Simply put, the little lock in your browser would be using antiquated technology easily broken. While quantum computing is still in its infancy and not yet capable of breaking RSA at scale, once it's perfected and commercialized it will likely become integrated into AI, making AI an even more powerful weapon wielded by those who seek our enslavement.

Many of those wanting to dictate your freedom are already using or experimenting with AI in its current form and will be more than happy to jump at the chance to enhance it even

And, it being so thorough and given the power by its owners to be the final arbiter, there would be little-to-no recourse for the citizen. The government is already experimenting with AI wherever possible. It would be

a devastating blow to freedom should AI ever be allowed to be used in such an anti-2A scheme against the American people.

In the end, freedom demands vigilance. If we allow technology to be weaponized against our rights—especially the right to self-defense protected by the Second Amendment—we risk building the very machine of our own subjugation.
